

From the Gusset

One of the themes in the Paradiso in Dante Alighieri's Divine Comedy is "glory." The great **poet** is going to try to describe to us a "shadow" of the glory of God that was revealed to him on his **pilgrimage** through **Heaven**. Remember I told you in my **Easter homily** that the goal of our lives is to make God Almighty not just **glad** that He created us, but our goal in life as **Catholics** should be that we make God exceedingly thrilled that He created us in the image and likeness of His Son! When we read the creation story of Gensis at the Easter Vigil Mass that rhythm of the repeating line kept coming up: God saw how good was the creation of that day – evening came, and morning followed.... But did you notice that God doesn't say that what He created was good for every day of creation!? On day two, when God separated the waters; so that, there was a dome of water in the sky and then a dome of water on the earth – God does not say that this is a **good** thing! The water (some **Church Fathers** seem to think that **water** is a symbol of God's grace) in the sky – Heaven – that God's grace in Heaven touches the Angels and Saints and these creatures make manifest God's love or God's glory – the citizens of Heaven radiate God's glory and so **Heaven** is highly luminous – filled with light! The water on earth; however, brings God's grace, but the creatures there both reflect and absconds with God's grace! God's love is horded by the bad angels and so also, sometimes (or in the case of Fr. Randy, more often than not) – sometimes we, human beings, horde God's grace to ourselves instead of re-radiating that grace – that love of God – to others. We are aware of this, because don't we pray in the Our Father Prayer – "Father, Thy will be done on earth (by me) just as Your will in Heaven is done by the Angels and Saints." See the problem is that you and I – we don't have a strong enough desire to want to give God's love away to others; and thus, allow God's glory to shine forth on earth as it does in Heaven. Dante ultimately writes the third Canticle of the Divine Comedy to help us (and himself) — to re-educate ourselves on what it means to be Catholic and receive the Sacraments of the Catholic Church (receive God's grace) and then radiate that grace – that **love** – that glory of God to all whom, we see on earth. You see, this sphere (the water beneath the dome) of God's love might be just as luminous as the sphere (the dome God called the sky)

of Heaven, if only we would reflect God's glory as He created us to do. That is why, we, the parishioners of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church, St. Mary of the Assumption Church, and St. Patrick Church – we all make a Spiritual Communion when we receive the Eucharist, because we desire something great. We desire that the love – that the grace – that the glory that God gives us in the Eucharist would shine forth from our souls and illuminate the souls of our loved ones that are dark with sin and ignorance and selfishness – that God, looking down from the dome of the sky called Heaven would see that the dome under the sky (the earth) was becoming more and more luminous with the light of His glory with every passing Sunday!

The Art and Architecture of our Catholic Churches

How is it that the Catholic Church where one worships God
—can be so influential on one's Faith!

One of the great joys of being the Pastor of three Parishes is that I get to bless multiple Easter Candles (Paschal Candles) at the Easter Vigil Mass. Each Church must have its own Paschal Candle, which is lit for all the Masses of Easter and is lit throughout the year at **Baptisms** and Funeral Masses. The liturgy for the blessing of the **Easter Candle** is called **the Lucernarium**, which includes the blessing of the Easter fire and the preparation of the Paschal Candle. So each year, I get to pick out the Easter **Candle** for our **three Churches**. One year, I simply ordered the same **Candle**, but typically I order a different Paschal Candle with a unique theme for each of the **Churches**. This year I chose "the Twelve Apostles" theme for St. Mary of the Assumption Church in West Brooklyn. This Paschal Candle highlights the chalice of blessing that the twelve drank from on the night of the Last



Supper. There is a wax profile of six apostles above the chalice and a wax profile of six of the apostles below the chalice. There are five incense pegs that are inserted into the candle in the shape of a Cross, and they are accompanied by the following prayer:

physically receive the precious Blood from the chalice – that because Fr. Randy broke off a small piece of the Host and placed it in the chalice, saying 'the secret prayer,' 'May this mingling of the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ bring eternal life to us who receive it' – that each of us does receive the Eucharist under both species even though we have physically only eaten of the Host. That Jesus does say to each of us at every Mass: TAKE THIS, ALL OF YOU, AND DRINK FROM IT, FOR THIS IS THE CHALICE OF MY BLOOD, THE BLOOD OF THE NEW AND ETERNAL COVENANT, WHICH WILL BE POURED OUT FOR YOU AND FOR MANY FOR THE FORGIVENESS OF SINS. DO THIS IN MEMORY OF ME. Our Twelve Apostle Paschal Candle in West Brooklyn reminds us that we are the Lord's Apostles in the Year of Grace 2024 – Jesus calls us to dine with Him every Sunday at the Mass – what difference does it make how long the homily is or whether the Cubs are playing at the same time or if the sun is shining or the winds are blowing stronger than ever – the Lord God is calling us to sup with His Son. Happy Easter!
