



Now, I don't know anything about basketball, **hockey**, or tennis – but I'm a big fan of **baseball** and **football**; and I think it is **fascinating** to see, who was considered **the best ball player** that year. One of the **interesting parts** (to me), as **Dante** visits **the nine Heavenly spheres**, is to learn, who is **the greatest soul** in that realm of **Heaven**. So, yes, '*everywhere*

A SPECIAL HANDKERCHIEF

One of my top 10 favorite lines by a Hollywood actor was spoken by Clark Gable to the actress Vivien Leigh in the Classic: Gone with the Wind. It comes at the end of the movie – from the same scene as the Iconic last line of Rhett Butler in response to what should Scarlet O'Hara do with her life. Scarlet is crying and Rhett says, "Here, take my handkerchief. Never at any crisis in your life have I known you to have a handkerchief." I have always





carried a **handkerchief** in my pocket ever since, I saw that **movie**. My Dad always carried a **handkerchief**, and at all **the crisis** in my life growing up, he would hand it to me to wipe my eyes when I **cried**, like the time, I popped out to second base at **the All-Star game** in the **Park District's Minor League Baseball game**. My **Mom treasured** the **handkerchiefs** that **her Mom** always kept in her purse (perhaps they were special to my Mom for the same reason Dad's **handkerchiefs** were special to me) – they became *meme wares* of **Granny**. A Saint name that has been by **tradition** in my family (most especially on my **Mother's side**) is **St. Catherine**. On my recent **pilgrimage** to **Rome** (last **November**, when **the Missionary priest** was here), I was surprised to find that the tomb of **St. Catherine of Siena** was open. I went into **the**

Dominican Church of *St. Mary's in Sopra Minerva* to obtain **the plenary indulgence** of visiting a **Dominican Church** during the Anniversary years of **St. Thomas Aquinas** — to find **pilgrims** praying on **the priest-side** of the main altar in **the Sanctuary**. The body of **St. Catherine** has been **entombed** under the main altar since her **death** in the **14th century**. In all of my four years of living in **Rome**, during my **seminary days** – I had never seen this, so I quickly

got out my handkerchief and touched it to the tomb of St. Catherine; and in the process created a third class relic. What does this mean for the Faithful of Sublette, West Brooklyn, and Maytown? Only that our celebrations of St. Catherine's Feast day (April 29th) and All Saints' Day (November 1st) will be all the richer in God's grace, because of the blessings St. Catherine will win for us when we honor her devout life.

Pilate also had an inscription written and put on the Cross. It read, "Jesus the Nazorean, the King of the Jews." Now many of the Jews read this inscription, because the place where Jesus was crucified was near the city; and it was written in Hebrew, Latin, and Greek. So, the chief priests of the Jews said to Pilate, "do not write, 'The King of the Jews,' but that He said, 'I am the King of the Jews.'" Pilate answered, "What I have written, I have written." — John 19: 19-22

The people, having **witnessed** many of Jesus' **miracles**, wanted to make Him their **King**; and yet, at the end, the people objected to **Pilate's** writing above **the Cross** – that Jesus was the people's **King**. I'm so **glad**, that **Pilate** stuck to his **guns**, and would not recant what he had written. For we, **Catholics**, do claim Jesus as our **King**. You and I have been **witnessing** the Lord's **miracles** in our life since the day we were **baptized**. Every Sunday, we watch our Lord work His **greatest miracle** – His **Passion**, death, **Resurrection**, and **Ascension** into glory in **the**



Eucharist of the Holy Mass! In earlier times, only a King could pardon someone from their sins against the government. We even have a remnant in our law today, that the Governor of the State can commute a sentence. Every time we go to **Reconciliation**, we claim that Jesus is our King, and we ask Him for forgiveness of our sins; and we believe that we are forgiven, for who, but God alone can forgive sins?! The place where Jesus is crucified is very near our city – it is on our altar in our city of **Sublette**, on our altar in our city of **West Brooklyn**, and it is even in our city of **Maytown**. We see the inscription that **Pilate** wrote above our **Crucifixes**, and we agree with **Pilate** – Jesus is our **King**! The Paschal Candle for Maytown's Church of St. Patrick for the Year of Grace 2024 is named: *Christus Rex* – 'Christ the King.' The artisans have fine metal leafing on the wax reliefs to give our **Easter Candle** the look of a **Gothic** stained glass window. Robed as a King and wearing a royal crown, Jesus is centered in green wax on the Candle. Above Him is the intertwined *alpha* and *omega* – symbolizing that Jesus is King of all mankind, King eternal, King of all Kings, and King of all the ages! Below Christ the King is the **bas relief** of the *Victorious Agnus Dei* – 'the Victorious Lamb of God' – a lamb **slain**, but sporting seven gold medals – those same seven sacraments (Christ's miracles) that you and I receive from our **King**, who is Christ the Lord. **Happy Easter**!
