From the Gusset

When Dante enters the sphere of the sun, which he also refers to as the Choir of Angels where the Power Angels reside (see the Art and Architecture column in this bulletin) — Dante meets a soul, whom he calls *"more than a man."* This Saint (and really all the Saints in this area of Heaven) was known for his wisdom on earth or his contemplation of



God while he was alive. This soul shines so brightly with God's love that Dante mistakes this Saint for an Angel rather than a man. Dante says, "in his contemplation (of God) he was more than a man." My friends, Dante hits on the goal of our life: to be more than a man, to be more than a woman, to be more than a firefighter, to be more than a wife, to be more than a husband— to fulfill our humanity is to be in contemplation with God. That is, to be one with God— to be more than a man is to be a part of the Body of Christ! Jesus Christ is true God and true man. Jesus is more than a man. He is God. Jesus is totally in love with His Father. The Son and the Father contemplate each other— They think only of the Other; so much so, that Jesus wants only to do His Father's will! <u>What is the Father's will</u>? The Father's will is only that Jesus would make each one of us His brothers and sisters. Jesus makes us a part of His own Body by giving us His flesh and His blood to eat and drink that we might contemplate God— that we might make God's will our will. When the Catholic receives Holy Communion— the Eucharist— he is more than a man, she is more than a woman— we become members of the Body of Christ— we become Christ-like by our reception of the Eucharist— we are both human and Divine.

We will be out at St. Patrick's Church in Maytown at 10:00am for a Holy 1/2 Hour



(one of the works for a Plenary Indulgence) and the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Then when they receive our Lord on Corpus Christi Sunday—they may tell our Lord, whom they are working this indulgence for! All parishioners are invited to this retreat! *The Art and Architecture of our Catholic Churches* How is it that the Catholic Church where one worships God —can be so influential on one's Faith!



Jesus was true man. and so He had a guardian Angel. Jesus was a priest, and so He had a priestly Angel from the **Power choir.** These are the two Angels that adorn the doors of the **Tabernacle in Mavtown** at St. Patrick's Church. **Both the Gospel of Luke** and the Gospel of John say that Mary Magdalene saw these **Angels on Easter** Sunday morning—one at the head and one at the feet of where the

Body of Jesus had been. The Body of Christ, the Eucharist, is what is kept inside of our Tabernacle in Maytown; and so here we find the two angels of the Christ. Eucharistic Prayer One prays, "in humble prayer we ask You, Almighty God: that these gifts be borne by the hands of Your holy Angel to Your altar on high in the sight of Your divine majesty, so that all of us, who through this participation at the altar received the most holy Body and Blood of Your Son, may be filled with every grace and heavenly blessing." Whether you buy the Theology that Fr. Randy has both a guardian Angel (because I am a true man) and a priestly Angel (because of my Ordination)— or whether you believe that a Catholic priest only has one Angel (a guardian Angel) and that I borrow our Lord's Angel from the Power choir— in either case, the priest prays this prayer at the Holy Mass and an Angel from the

Power choir takes the bread and the wine lickety-split to Heaven and then replaces them with the Body and Blood, the Soul and Divinity of our Lord in Holy Communion. What is left over after we are given the Bread from Heaven in this Sacred Meal is placed in reserve in our Tabernacle. In St. Patrick's Church in Maytown, the two holy Angels of Christ watch over our Lord, who is really, truly, and substantially present in the Blessed Sacrament. Happy Easter!
