

From the Gusset

Of course, everywhere you look in Heaven is paradise. This could be the byline of Dante's Divine Comedy — that although the grace of God does not fall on all in the same way — all are exceedingly thrilled to be in Heaven. God shines the grace of His love on some souls more than He does on others. So, in the higher spheres of Heaven the souls shine with the brilliance of a small star, but in the lower spheres of Heaven; Dante can barely recognize the souls. Remember in the sphere of the moon, the lowest level of paradise, the souls were bright, but Dante could just barely make out their faces. He could see his sister-in-law's face — Piccarda — Dante says: "in your marvelous appearance their shines I know not what, but the Divine image which alters you from my first

images of you on earth." You see, Piccarda looks more like Jesus to Dante (now that she is in Heaven) then she looks like her earthly self! But in the sphere of the sun, the souls are so bright, **Dante** can't tell who the souls are until they **introduce** themselves to him. The souls on the sphere of the sun rush up to Dante and they just start telling him all about the love God gave them during their lifetime on earth. They speak of their vocational Sacrament: "God gave me His divine love when I was married" (the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony), "God gave me His grace when I became a priest" (the Sacrament of Holy Orders), and some say, "God blessed me with His grace when I was ordained a single person" (the sacrament of Confirmation). Then they tell **Dante** how they did some **heroic feat** on **earth** all because God gave them **the grace** to do that action, speak that word, think that holy thought.... The souls in Heaven won't stop discussing the glory that God gave to them when Jesus Christ bestowed a Sacrament of the Catholic Church upon them. As the psalmist says in Psalm 145: "may my mouth speak the praise of the Lord, so that all flesh may bless God's holy name forever and ever." Dante comes to the understanding that he is to spend his life on earth glorifying God just as the souls in Heaven glorify God in the next life. Isn't this what we pray when we pray the Our Father **Prayer**? That God's will be done on earth just as it is in Heaven by the angels and Saints. The angels and Saints are always praising God—we practice that 'always' on earth especially when we celebrate the Holy Mass. I don't know about you, but I look forward to listening to my parents, my older brother, my favorite uncle, my godparents — I look forward to listening to all my deceased relatives glorifying God in *Heaven*. I look forward to my deceased relatives

telling me the stories of how God gave them His grace in the Sacraments of the Catholic Church, and how they then went forth and used that grace to glorify God in their earthly life. And of course, I look forward to telling them how generous God was with His love to me — after all — didn't I celebrate the Eucharist every day of my priestly life!

The Art and Architecture of our Catholic Churches

How is it that the Catholic Church where one worships God
—can be so influential on one's Faith!



During the forty years in the desert, the tabernacle was a shrine or sanctuary, shaped like a tent and built according to the detailed instructions given to Moses – the tabernacle represented God's **presence** to His **Chosen People**. Our **tabernacle** today is the exact same thing: a symbol of God's presence to Catholic citizens. Our Eucharistic Revival Prayer prays that we can adore our Lord every time the Eucharist is raised above the altar in the Mass, we can adore our Lord every time we bow before our Lord in the Monstrance of our Home Holy Hours, and also that we can adore our Lord behind the locked the doors of the tabernacle any time we enter into the Church! I always tell the CCD kids that the tabernacle is where Jesus lives on earth whenever the Mass is not being celebrated. As we get ready for the culmination of the Easter Season with Pentecost, we will take a tour of our three Church tabernacles – that place where our Lord's true presence resides. Our Lady of Perpetual Help has a magnificent tabernacle - arrayed all in **gold**—there are **two angels** on the front doors of the tabernacle and the tabernacle is topped by a glorious crown – Jesus is indeed our King! Will Klein had his Aunt make tabernacle veils for us – they skirt the doors of our tabernacle and cover its crown like a zucchetto. The veils are of exquisite damask material, and they come in the liturgical colors that symbolize the seasons: white for Christmas and Easter, purple for Advent and Lent, and
