

### From the Gusset

Sin, Satan, and the world are always trying to take things away from us. God, on the other hand, is always trying to give us things! Just a quick example: we were all given a finite amount of time to live in this world — God already knows the time and the date He will call us home to Heaven. By committing sin — we deprive ourselves of precious time in which we could be loving God by talking to Him in prayer or being loved by God

directly when we receive the Sacraments of His Son. The Devil also tries to get us to sin, so that we





have less **time** to show God's **love** to others by **loving** them in our **thoughts**, **words**, and **actions**. One of the greatest things that God gave us through His Son, Jesus, was our **Blessed**Mother. Remember, one of the last gifts Jesus gave to us (as He was dying on **the Cross**) was **Mary** – she became our Mother. **Bishop Flores** told us, priests at **the Eucharistic**Congress, that the gifts Jesus gives <u>cannot</u> be taken away by sin, Satan, or the world (although they will try to rob us of them). Mary cradled the Body of Christ in her arms when He was taken down from the Cross (the 13<sup>th</sup> Station of the Cross). By our reception of Holy Communion, we become the poor Body of Christ. Our Lady always cradles us in her arms – she always comforts us – our Mother Mary always loves us! When Mary looks at us, she sees her Son!! It has

already been given to us as a gift from God (it is just that we do not yet have the eyes of Faith to see it quite clearly) that our fellow man is made in the image and likeness of Jesus Christ. Let us ask our Lady of the Assumption, our Mother, to see each other as the poor broken Body of Christ — that we would hold each other close to our hearts — that we would always love our brother and sister — that we would have the vison of Mary to see Jesus Christ in one another!



### The Art and Architecture of our Catholic Churches

How is it that the Catholic Church where one worships God
—can be so influential on one's Faith!

Monstrance. A truly artisan work of metallurgy, the Monstrance is chalked-full of symbols and images; including, four busts on its base. On the front of the Monstrance is an image from the waist up of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Reading around the Monstrance base, next comes St. Joseph holding a lily. At the back is St. John the Baptist wearing a camel's hair outfit, and to our Lord's right is our Lady's Immaculate Heart. Like most of the intricate details on the Monstrance, they are not readily visible to the Church Holy Hour adorer. That is why, when I take our Lord in this Monstrance to a Family's house for a Home Holy Hour — I like to have the family members come up, one at a time, for a closer inspection of this 'pearl of great price.' When it comes time for Benediction and I give an individual a private blessing for all whom

they have prayed for during the Holy Hour – I tell the person to touch the specific bust that relates most closely to their vocation. So, the father of the house would touch St. Joseph, and ask this great Saint to help him be the best husband and father he can be with the help of the Lord's blessing. The mother would touch Mary's Immaculate Heart, and ask the Virgin Mother's intercession to be the best wife and mother she can be. Single people are encouraged to touch either the Sacred Heart of our Lord or St. John the Baptist. We should never forget to express our gratitude to God for the vocation the Almighty has given to us. A Holy **Hour** is the perfect chance to do this—for what a Holy Hour truly is, at its essence, is a time to spend with God—allowing God to be God and ourselves to be whom God has asked us to be!
