

From the Gusset

Bishop Flores, the Bishop of Brownsville, Texas, gave the final talk in the priest break-out session to conclude the Eucharistic Congress – I have never been moved as much by a talk in my 19 years as a priest. One of many eye-opening remarks that Bishop Daniel made was: there is something missing in the Prodigal Son parable! I have always thought that, if

for some reason the Devil got his wish, and all of Sacred Scripture could be wiped out from print and from our memory – that as long as the Trinity saved the Prodigal Son parable, the Catholic Faith would still flourish. So, when Bishop talked about something 'missing' from the parable – I was all ears! He said, what is missing in the story is the elder son going out in search of his prodigal brother. The older son, the son that stayed at home – that son is you and I. We have never left the Church, we are obedient to the Father, we have always gone to work in the field like Dad asked us to, but we have failed to be like Jacob's favorite son, Joseph. Remember, Jacob loved Joseph most of all, but Dad sent his son to go find his brothers, who were getting into trouble in Shechem. The U.S. Bishops have instigated a project called: Walking with One. We have been asked by the Catholic Church in America to bring back just one Catholic, who has wandered away from the sheepfold – bring back to the celebration of the Mass, one prodigal brother or sister. I am asking the 9 Eucharistic Congress pilgrims, who



accompanied me to **Indianapolis**, to each adopt one family from each of our three parishes, one family member from their own **family**, and one **politician** either at the local or state or national level, and pray daily a decade of the Eucharistic Congress Rosary they were given for each of these five classes of persons. These nine have been given much, and so I am expecting much from them, but I would also ask each one of you, reading this Gusset column, to choose just **one person**, whom you wish, would sit next to you at the Mass every Sunday. In this way, we help the prodigal person, we love, to return to the Father's house – that **the fattened**

house – that **the fattened calf** might be killed and
we could **celebrate** that
we are God's **family**again.



The Art and Architecture of our Catholic Churches

How is it that the Catholic Church where one worships God
—can be so influential on one's Faith!



For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed. 1Corinthians 15:52

I like to pray at the graveside service of the Funeral Mass – I like to pray the following prayer: Lord, Jesus Christ, command that N's. Guardian Angel should be stationed at this grave site; so that, when You come at the end of time, N's. Angel might draw the love of Your Sacred Heart to this cemetery, and You, Lord God, may command Your servant to rise, and join You in Your Father's **Kingdom.** We have, at our **cemetery** in Sublette, two Angels blowing their trumpets (at the East and the West end) of the **cemetery**. Indeed, where do our **Guardian Angels** go following our **death**? They (as in life) must watch over the body that they were assigned to protect. So, whether you are buried full-body or buried as cremated remains – your Guardian **Angel** must watch over your **bodily** remains, until the second Coming of Christ;



and then, each of our Angels will call out to our Lord, "Hey, Jesus! Over here! Over here! Here lies the body of your good servant 'so-and-so,' open their coffin that they may know that You are God, and rejoin their souls to a glorified body, from which they will praise You

and Your Father for all eternity!" Recently a kind-hearted parishioner refurbished our two Angels, who herald the 2nd coming of Christ. It turns out these are very expensive statues — manufactured by the Daprato company of Chicago. The statues were repainted, and their bases were repainted as well with gold trim to accentuate their dimensionality. It is interesting that our first article for this column was about the St. Joseph Daprato statue and now our last article in the series on Art and Architecture is also about a Daprato statue.
