


From the Gusset WALKING WITH ONE

Part of leaving Seminary in the United States and starting my Theological studies in Rome meant that I had to get a new Spiritual Director. I remember the North American College put all of us "new men" in the refectory, and the 8 or so Spiritual Directors that served the College in the Eternal City took turns speaking to us about their call to the priesthood and how they viewed spiritual

direction. After the formal program, we had refreshments and a chance to ask the Spiritual **Directors** more poignant questions and ask one of them, if they would consider being our **Spiritual Director**. I would like to do something very similar for all the parishioners of **Our** Lady of Perpetual Help, St. Mary of the Assumption, and St. Patrick's Church. There are ten Eucharistic Congress pilgrims, who each had a unique experience celebrating Mass, adoring God in Holy Hours, walking in Eucharistic Procession, and going to different talks on the Catholic Faith in the Holy Eucharist. On Wednesday, September 18th at 6:30pm, there will be a Holy Hour in Sublette's Church. During the Holy Hour, the pilgrims will give a short talk about their experience encountering Jesus at the Congress, what graces did they receive from our Lord, and how did God **transform** them during this once in a lifetime event? After the Holy Hour, we will retire to the Hall for refreshments (one pilgrim is making homemade pies for us!), and you will have time to ask the pilgrims any questions you might have and ask them if they would **pray** for someone from your family to have a greater love of our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. Each of the pilgrims was given a special Rosary (made specifically for the 10th Eucharistic Congress and touched to first-class relics of St. Fr. McGivney and the six Mexican martyrs) and I am asking the pilgrims to pray their Rosary everyday – dedicating one decade of the Rosary to one person/family from each of our three Churches, the fourth decade for a member of their own family, and the fifth decade for an elected government official. Wouldn't that be special, if one of the pilgrims joined you in praying for a member of your family to come back to the practice of their Catholic Faith or become Catholic !?! I'm sure that you will

be touched by something **one pilgrim** said during their witness talk, and then the Holy Spirit will prompt you to ask that **pilgrim** for their **prayers**. This is all part of the **U.S. Bishops' WALKING WITH ONE PROGRAM**. **Bishop Cousins** said, 'what could be greater than a nation with 70 million Catholics? A nation with 140 million Catholics!' If each of us brings just one person to a greater **understanding** of the Son's true presence in **the Eucharist** – how great will our **country** be in God the Father's eyes?! **Yours on the Path** Fr. These Masses will be prayed that you might fall more in love with your Guardian Angel, because human beings tend to listen better to the one they have given their heart's care to!



THE MASS AND THE SAINTS / VISIO DIVINA



We will be learning the subject matter of **the beauty of the Mass** through **the eyes of the Saints** for our **RCIA classes** this year, but we will supplement the knowledge gained by our study of **the Mass** with a new prayer technique called: *Visio Divina*. I think most of us are aware of, or at least have heard of, **the prayer technique** called: *Lectio Divina*. *Lectio Divina* may be translated: *'sacred reading*.' This is a way of meditating on **Sacred Scripture** by immersing ourselves in the stories of **the Bible**, so that we actually become a **'character'** in **the Biblical scene**. *Lectio Divina* prevents **the Scriptures** from remaining at a safe distance and not being applied **personally** to us. Such as, reading **the Good Samaritan story** and then saying: **'Oh, I would never be**

like the priest or the Levite and pass the wounded man by. I would have stopped and helped him. I always help those, who need my help.' Rather, *Lectio Divina* allows God's word (**the Bible**) to **personally engage me** by involving me **intimately** in my reading of **the Word of God**. *Lectio Divina* is a greatly practiced **prayer technique** in the Western Church. In the Eastern Church, **Icons** decorate their **worship space**, and the practice of *Visio Divina* developed as a **prayer technique**— simply another way to allow God to come into our **hearts**. **St. Paul** says that **"the eyes of your heart maybe enlightened, that you may know what is the hope that belongs to God's call...." (Eph 1:18) In** *Visio Divina***, one allows an Icon** to communicate **Catholic truths** to us in visible form. Although any artwork could accomplish this holy action, **Icons** are particularly suited to inspire quiet, **contemplative** study and since **Icons** are written to decorate Churches and be used in **Divine Liturgy (the Mass)** – we can trust that

Icons (like **Sacred Scripture**, Itself) are used by God to **illumine** our minds and **hearts**. *Visio Divina* is a new topic of study for **Fr. Randy**, and that is why I will be using it in our **RCIA classes** this year; because, I have always insisted since coming here **July** 1st in 2014 – that **RCIA** is not just for those who wish to become **Catholic**. No, **RCIA** is **adult catechesis** for any, who wish to learn more about their **Catholic Faith**. For we could never learn all there is to know about God; and yet, the more we learn about God, the more we realize how **passionately** God is in **love** with us! Every lover is **humbled** by how much his beloved **loves** him. Come to our **RCIA classes** on **Tuesday nights** (starting **September 24th**) and fall deeper in **love** with *the Tremendous Lover* we call God.
