The Holy Spirit was wanting to inspire in each of our ten Eucharistic Congress Pilgrims a great desire to pray for those, who do not believe as strongly as the **Pilgrims** themselves do – that Jesus is present in our lives most definitively in the Eucharist of the Catholic Mass. The Pilgrims came back to Sublette, West Brooklyn, and Maytown seeking souls to pray for - that God might find other people to pour Himself into! God is not content to continually pour Himself into the same number of Sunday Mass goers that He poured Himself into last Sunday. No, God made every human person in the image and likeness of His Son. God desires to pour His divine Love into every soul – to make all of us "one in the Body of Christ!" You see, 'all' of us are called to eat His Body and 'all' of us are called to drink His Blood! We had an extraordinary Holy Hour last Wednesday, and our Pilgrims each gave a witness talk about their experience at the Eucharistic Congress, and then they went campaigning for the names of people from your family to pray for. ### **CEMETERY MASS AT MAYTOWN**



Our three Parishes are responsible for the upkeep of five cemeteries, and this upkeep is more than just cutting the grass. We are responsible for praying the Mass for all of the souls buried in our cemeteries. Part of this obligation is fulfilled with our weekly Pro Populo Mass, but we even go above and beyond this by praying at least one Mass at the cemeteries' altar each year. We will fulfill our final cemetery altar Mass by praying at St. Patrick's cemetery altar

at 8:00am Sunday, September 29th. That same day, St. Patrick's will also hold a fundraiser by selling pumpkins, squash, gourds, and other fall decorations.





At the Eucharistic Congress both Bishop Barron and Bishop Cozzens told us that there are roughly 70 million Catholics in our country. What could be better than 70 million Catholics? The answer: 140 million Catholics! Bishop Barron challenged us to bring just one person into the Church. This is what RCIA is designed for—to bring one person into the Church who has not been baptized (Catechumen) or a person who has been baptized, but has yet to receive the Eucharist or Confirmation (Candidate). Bishop Cozzens told us that the 70 million number is weighted with many 'lukewarm Catholics.' Our RCIA classes are also designed to help lifelong Catholics have a greater appreciation of their Catholic Faith. Our first class of the 2024-2025 year will be Tuesday, September 24th at 6:30pm come and enrich your Catholic Faith maybe even to the point of evangelizing another!

## THE MASS AND THE SAINTS



When looking at the ancient Churches that had survived down to the present day, St. Robert Bellarmine (1542-1621) found two things to be noteworthy. One is that almost all Churches possess three parts (in the likeness of Solomon's temple). They have a vestibule before the entrance, a nave, and the sanctuary, where none are allowed to go but the priests and the clergy who minister there. The second noteworthy item about ancient Churches is that normally the Churches are directed to the east. St. Gregory of Nyssa commented that, although God may be seen everywhere – He is not limited to any particular

place, but because our first home was in the east – the dwelling place of Paradise – that Churches ought to be constructed with the main altar toward the east. As Bishop St. Robert Bellarmine pointed out, when our Lord died on the Cross He was looking toward the west; and so, we ought to pray facing the east, as if to look at the Face of the Crucified One as He dies for us. Now since Vatican II switched the whole kit and caboodle around, Pope Benedict XVI stepped in to say, "wherever the priest places the altar Crucifix – he

declares that is "*the liturgical east.*" Thus the priest always looks toward the east—he looks into the Face of Christ on the **Cross.** The congregation – in looking into the face of the priest - sees the Christ reflected back to them. Remember, the people could tell Moses had spoken to God, because his face was bleached white! Pope Benedict was able to say this, because it has always been the Churches' teaching that the priest stands in the person of Christ in the Mass - uttering the words, which change bread and wine into the **Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.** The St. Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274) was quick to point out that it is fitting to pray toward the east, because the Christ is the light of the world and the sun rises in the eastern sky – just as the Christ rises in our hearts.
