
The Treasure Buried in the Cornfields of Sublette September 8, 2024

As the town of **Sublette** celebrates their 170th anniversary this weekend, we give thanksgiving to God for the pearl of great price or the treasure buried in the cornfields of Sublette that Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church is. Just think, that God knew that a **Catholic Church** would be built in Sublette 13.8 billion years ago. God predestined that we might praise His glorious favor (in the words of **St. Paul** in his letter to the Ephesians) – that we might thank God every time we celebrate the Holy Mass for bestowing on us His Beloved Son. That through the **blood** of Christ continually poured out on our altar – that we might be given the forgiveness of our sins and receive immeasurable graces (the words of **St. Paul** again). As we celebrate the Mass on this historic weekend, we will make a Spiritual Communion for one member of our individual families, who is farthest from the practice of their Catholic Faith, and I would ask you as your priest to make a Spiritual Communion for one family who lives in Sublette, who is not Catholic; so that, they

might be made holy by the precious Blood of our Lord. One more fascinating *Spiritual note* to remind you of is that God assigns an Angel to every town or city. This Angel is from the choir of Angels known as *the Principality Angels*. This Angel of Sublette constantly watches over us, protects us from evil, shows us the path we must walk to future glory, and his voice can be heard every time you hear the bells ring out from Our Lady's Church. This Angel glorifies God at noon and at 6:00pm each day, and before and after each Mass that is celebrated. This is so that we might be reminded of all the spiritual blessings we receive, how God has chosen us to be holy, and that God has predestined us to be His adopted sons and daughters through Jesus Christ. in our midst, He dwells with us, fills us with grace and truth, restores morality in our hearts, nourishes us with virtue, consoles the afflicted, and strengthens the weak. How blessed are our towns of Sublette, West Brooklyn, and Maytown – that God has placed a Church in them; so that, we may enter into them and find shelter from the storms of this world and find perfect peace!

THE MASS AND THE SAINTS

A Church is not a **barber shop** or a **drug store** or even a **restaurant**; rather, **a Church** is the dwelling place of Angels, and why do Angels dwell in a Catholic Church? Because, as St. John Chrysostom (347-407) so eloquently put it: a Church is the Kingdom of God – a Church is where God's Son **lives** – for truly Jesus is really, truly, and substantially present in the Blessed Sacrament reserved in the Tabernacle of every Catholic Church. St. Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274) was quick to also point out that the **Church** is also **the bride** of Jesus Christ. A building in which the Sacrament is celebrated symbolizes the spouse of Jesus and is called a Church. A Bishop consecrates a Church to show that the **Catholic Church** has been made holy by **the passion**, death, Resurrection, and Ascension into glory of Jesus Christ. You see, Jesus gave Himself up for His **bride** – poured all of **the holiness** that God the Father gave to Him – Jesus **poured** all of this Love into His **spouse** to make her holy! **Pope St. Paul VI**, of our own time, (1897-1978) spoke of how every **Catholic Church** makes the words of the prophets and the words of Angels true – that God is with us – Emmanuel, when he said, "not only while the sacrifice is offered and the Sacrament is received, but as long as the Eucharist is kept in our Churches - Christ is truly *the Emmanuel*. Day and **night**, He is
