


From the Gusset

The 'BTB'* Bishop from Brownsville, Texas said, "the continuous movement of God's Love is Who God is."

Perhaps the greatest question that a man ever asked of God was Moses question to the burning bush: what is Your Name?

When I go to the Israelites and say to them, 'the God of your fathers has sent me to you, if they ask me, Your name, what am I to tell them? "I AM sent me to you," is God's response. God is forever telling His favorite creature, the man (you), "I AM the One, Who pours Himself out. I AM He that gives Himself to you!" The drama of Salvation is for



God to figure a way for us to receive what He pours out! The biggest question on your mind and on my mind, when we wake up in the morning should be: how am I going to allow God to pour His Love into me today – how am I going to become the receptacle that can receive God's Love? Thankfully Jesus Christ has built His Church, for it is the Catholic Church in dispensing the Sacraments, which when we receive them (the Sacraments) changes our hearts, so we can receive what God wants to give us. See, our hearts have been hardened by sin, and they cannot receive what God wishes to pour into them. And so, when we confess our sins, God changes our stony hearts back into flesh – makes them worthy receptacles of His Love. You see, that is all that has happened in the fall from grace of the 'Culture of Death,'—by turning from God – by not allowing God to pour Himself into us – by our sins – by our selfishness – by our ignorance - mankind has turned his heart into stone, and said 'no' to God. 'No, I will not allow God to pour His Love into me and create another human being.' Because we keep the great Commandment – because we love God and we love our neighbor as our self, we pray and we make reparations for our neighbor's sins (especially his sins against 'Life'). We don't want to lose our brother and our sister to the Culture of Death – we don't want their hearts to remain hardened and incapable of receiving whatever God wants to give them – we refuse to be silent, and so we plead with God on their behalf. "Lord, forgive them, they know not what they do. Lord, as hard as their **hearts** are – so just as blind are their eyes. Please forgive my **neighbor**, who would have or even contemplate an abortion. I don't want to lose my neighbor to the Culture of Death – I want him to live next door to me, so that when You come at the end of time, both of us may enter Your Kingdom!" We pray this prayer on Pro-Life Sunday, we go to Mass and receive the Eucharist, and then (if we are able) we participate in the Life Chain in Mendota at 1:00pm, and in full view of the world, we pray for our neighbor, who wants to move away from God and us. We pray silently for an hour, that just as the Holy Spirit has brought us the Christ in the Eucharist that we received at Mass, so the Holy Spirit would bring Jesus Christ into the hearts of all expectant mothers and their man just as the Holy Spirit brought the baby Jesus into the womb of St. Joseph's wife, the Blessed Mother.

THE MASS AND THE SAINTS

Why does the Church call us to fast before we receive the Eucharist? **St. John Chrysostom** so eloquently put it: for just as the crown comes at the end of the Olympic games, so at the end of the fast comes a pure **Communion!** I always blame myself for **forgetting** this. How Jesus gives me, a sinner, His royal crown whenever I receive Holy Communion. I love to pray the 5th Glorious Mystery for my Dad whenever I pray the Rosary on Wednesday and Sunday. I ask God to give my Dad a small crown in Heaven for having lived his vocation faithfully. Indeed, St. Thomas Aguinas says that one of the spiritual gifts our glorified body is given is that we are given a **crown**, if we lived our **vocations** for the glory of God. The tradition of fasting is quite old. St. Augustine said, that the Holy Spirit was pleased that we should honor the Blessed Sacrament so much that no other **food** should enter our mouth before the Body of our Lord. The Doctor of Grace said that the whole world observes this practice of fasting; not because, Jesus said that we should do this—for on Holy Thursday, the

Biblical Purposes for Fasting

To strengthen prayer. To seek God's guidance. To express grief.

To see deliverance or protection.

To express repentance and the return to God. To humble oneself before God.

To express concern for the work of God.

To minister to the needs of others.

To overcome temptation and dedicate yourself to God.

To express love and worship to God.

Apostles did not receive **the Eucharist fasting**; but this is one of those things that **the Apostles** arranged. In speaking about 'the holy fast,' St. Aquinas said, that when we fast, we show our Lord that He is given first place in our hearts. St. Paschasius acknowledged that we are composed of body and soul—that our body is fed by food, and our noblest part (our soul) is fed with the Heavenly delight of the Eucharist. When we fast, Paschasius said, self-control reigns and we restrain our fleshly desires allowing our minds to gain a new strength to understand the

Mystery we have received in the Mass. This is why St. Thomas
Aquinas loved to celebrate the Mass and then write the parts of his great Summa Theologica.
