
# Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time November 10, 2024





### From the Gusset

"For our struggle is not with flesh and blood, but with the Principalities, with the Powers...." Ephesians 6:12

**Tradition** holds that God made **nine choirs of angels**. Each of the three Persons of God made three choirs of angels to serve Him; thus, 3 times 3 is 9. But of all the Choirs – there were two, which gave God the most trouble: the Power angels and the Principality angels. These two groups of angels had the highest rate of defection; that is, a great number of **Power angels** and **Principality angels** turned evil – they sinned against God and fell from grace. This is what St. Paul is pointing out to the Ephesians and us, that we don't have trouble so much with flesh and blood – that is other human beings, but our struggle is mainly with these evil angels. We all have trouble being obedient to those who are placed in authority over us, this is because we are egged

on by the evil Principality angels not to be docile to the guidance of rightful superiors, and we all have trouble acknowledging the power of the grace that comes to us in the Sacraments of the Catholic Church. This is because the evil Power angels trick us: that God could not possibly love us, so much, that the Father gives to us the very same love He gives to His Son (because God the Father thinks we are His sons and daughters!) when we receive the Eucharist (and the other Sacraments). St. Paul recommends six things in his letter to the Ephesians, if we are to win the battle with these evil angels. NUMBER 1: hold your ground. God said He adopted you as His son or daughter on the day of your **Baptism**—that God loves you – just keep repeating this to yourself as often as you can: "I am God's beloved. He is well pleased with me." **NUMBER 2:** gird your loins and hold fast – be righteous – be perfectly content with your vocation. If you are single, thank God you are single, if you are married, thank God you are married and especially to your particular spouse. Don't desire a different vocation or don't desire a different spouse. NUMBER 3: be prepared to bring the Gospel to others – how beautiful are the feet of the messengers of God's Word. NUMBER 4: hold on to your Catholic Faith. Believe that Jesus died for you to win for you a crown in heaven. The crown you will

wear for all eternity is all **polished up** and ready to go – perfectly sized to fit your noggin. NUMBER 5: take up the scriptures as a fencing artist would take up his foil, and attack these bad angels as Jesus did in the desert; that is, with **Scripture**. And finally, the **SIXTH** way to prepare to parry the evil angels is to pray at every opportunity for help from the Holy Spirit. There are six weapons to fight evil angels, because God creates 'in sixes;' that is, there were 6 days of creation, and so there are six ways to stand

firm against the tactics of the Devil.

# THE MASS AND THE SAINTS

We call it 'the opening prayer,' but its proper title is 'the collect.' St. Albert the Great said, that the prayer is called **the collect** for two reasons. First, **the priest**, who knows **'the secrets'** of his people, collects all these secrets and offers them in prayer to our Lord. See, the people tell their secret wants to the priest: 'Fr. Randy, my daughter wants to get married – would you please pray her Wedding Mass, and ask God to make her and her fiancée one flesh,' or 'Fr. Randy, my wife has just died – would you please pray her Funeral Mass, and ask Jesus to come to earth and take her spirit back with Him – when Jesus returns to the righthand of His Father,' or 'Fr. Randy, the one, whom we love, is sick – would you please pray a Mass for their healing, and ask God to restore them to good health, so they may continue to glorify God with their vocation.' Or the priest prays the Sunday Mass, because he knows the secrets of his Community – that they wish to have **the blood** of Christ fresh on their lips that they might thank God for giving them the great gift of the Eucharist again for yet another week that Jesus might come along with them as they journey on the path that leads to Heaven. The second reason, this **prayer** is called **the collect** is because it is made for the people who are **collected** in a Community before the priest and God. See, the work of God is always to collect (to gather) – the work of the Devil is always to scatter (to disperse). St. Alphonsus Liguori (1696-1787) said the collect asks God for the graces bound up with the Mystery of the day. For example, during Easter Season: to ask for the grace to rise with Christ, or at the Ascension, to ask for the grace to dwell with Jesus in spirit in Heaven, or to ask for the graces that we wish to receive through the intercession of the Saint, whose Feast Day we are celebrating. The number of petitions in the collect should be 'uneven;' that is, either one, three, five, or seven – but no more than seven (because Jesus taught the Apostles to pray for 7 petitions in the "Our Father," and to do more would be to speak too much and weary our God and lessen our **devotion!**). You see, 'even' numbers are based on the number 2, and two is a departure from unity. According to St. Augustine (354-430), this is why, when God created the world, He did not bless the works of the second day, even though He blessed the works of all the other days. It is said; therefore, that God loves uneven numbers, because God detests division in all matters. Remember, God said, "a father will be against his son, and a daughter against her mother,...." The collect almost

always ends with: 'through our Lord.'
For we are heard by God not for our own merits, but for Christ's, and so the priest

- prays in the person of Christ – and so concludes the prayer as if it is the Son, who is asking these things from His
