JUBILEE YEAR 2025 WE ARE PILGRIMS OF HOPE

I lived in **Rome** for four years and I walked past the Church of **St. John the Baptist**, at the foot of the Janiculum hill, by **the Tiber river**, everyday when I went to school, and I never **realized** that **the Church** housed a relic of **St. Mary Magdalene**! An **Art History Guide** gave us a walking tour of **the via Giuliana**, when I was on my recent **pilgrimage** to **Rome**, and she just

casually reminded us to touch **the relic** (a very *Italian custom* – the prayer technique of *praying* with the Saints by touching their relics) of the foot of Mary Magdalene as we left the Church. I was amazed! Bishop Flores, from Brownsville Diocese in Texas, says that "recognition is the sweetest grace of the New Testament." Remember, Mary was searching for the Body of our Lord on Easter Sunday morning. She had come with the other women to anoint the Body of Jesus, but with the stone already rolled away, the Roman Soldiers having fled their post, and the Body no where to be found – Mary had come to the conclusion that someone had stolen the Body of our Lord. She was crying, when she came upon a Man, whom she assumed was the Gardener: Sir, if you carried Him away, tell me where You laid him, and I will take him. (John 20:15) Each one of us has an ache in our heart when we lose *a loved one* to death - we long to see them again! When we celebrate their Funeral Mass, we intensely watch the priest as he celebrates the Eucharist, because when the Eucharist is raised above the altar, we actually glimpse the Christ in His Flesh—see the Body of Christ! We, Catholics, have come to recognize God in the breaking of **the Bread** at **the Holy Mass**. That is why **The BTB Bishop** says, "recognition is the sweetest grace." Our eyes have been opened to see Heavenly realities even though we look with earthly eyes! Jesus simply says 'Mary's name,' and she recognizes our Lord in that garden near the tomb. I have touched my pocket Icon of Our Lady of Perpetual Help to the reliquary of the foot of **St. Mary Magdalene**. If you would like a relic of this great



Saint who searched for Jesus (and because she searched – she <u>found</u>), simply ask **Fr. Randy**; and I will create a 3rd class relic for you, so that you can go in haste on your pilgrimages during this Jubilee Year with St. Magdalene and be gifted with *the sweetest grace* of the New Testament – recognition of how much God loves you!

The Art of the Last Supper

This is another **Tintoretto** Last Supper (1591)–this one graces the sanctuary wall of the Benedictine Church of St. George in Venice. Remember the Benedictines are all about *working* and *praying*! The monks worked with Tintoretto and really honed the artist's style of putting the everyday (the mundane) right next to the




Spiritual! This **Last Supper** is a great banquet with many people (mostly **the poor** – notice **the poor man** begging the Disciple at the left end of the table for scraps from the table) surrounding our Lord and the Twelve. **The Table** is positioned at an angle to give the painting great **depth perception**. In the foreground a man dressed in lavish **clothes** is offered to take **a Host** from **a ciboria**, but refusingly, he points to **another table** decked out with all types of **sumptuous food** – this table parallels our Lord's **Last Supper Table**. The **symbolism** is easy to read: so many prefer what **this world** has to offer instead of what God is offering us. The master stroke of **Tintoretto** – something I have never seen in any other **rendition** of the **Last Supper** – is that Jesus feeds His Disciples **the Eucharist** with **both hands**; that is, **wholeheartedly**!! God cannot wait **to pour** all of His **love** into you when you come to **the altar**! Do you **love** as much as I do, **the Angels swirling** about the room?! These **Angelic creatures** leave **Heaven** to **surround** Jesus

(and us) at every Mass!



JUBILEE PILGRIMAGE


Did you notice **the oil lamp burning** in the **Tintoretto** painting of the **Last Supper** that is reproduced in the above article – it represents the Holy Spirit?! The Holy Spirit **illumines** all believers with the light of **Hope**. The Holy Spirit is an **ever-burning lamp** – burning brightly – He sustains and **invigorates** our lives. Notice what the Holy Spirit is doing when He **illuminates** the Upper room – He sheds light to open our eyes to what Jesus wishes to do in the world: **pour** God's **love** into our **hearts**. (**Romans 5:5**) **Catholics** always **Hope** that we will share in **the glory** of God. We have the sure and certain **Hope** that God will give us all of His **love** and this **love** will bind us so closely to God that nothing that ever happens in this **world** could separate us from God. We are **pilgrims** of **Hope**, so let us journey together in this **Jubilee Year** to that **Table** that the Holy Spirit so **brightly illumes** – **the altar** of your Church.



THE MASS AND THE SAINTS

3D is all **the rage**! Yet, have you ever heard of **Creation's "three-fold frame?"** Just as **Creation** has **length**, **height**, and **width**; it also has, what Theologians call the **3-fold frame** of 1) **the Angels**, 2) the **human persons** on **earth**, and 3) the **human souls** in **Purgatory**. Whenever **the Mass** is celebrated *thanksgiving* is given to God for whenever **the Eucharist** is celebrated a remedy is given for **the Angels** that fell from grace, for **the militant Church** (we on **earth**) who are **redeemed**, and those who are detained in **Purgatory** are set **free**! **St. Albert the Great** says that we must

always given *thanks* to God *always* and *everywhere*. *Always* both in the time of this world and in the time of eternity in Heaven. Everywhere because by Christ's death and Resurrection things in **Heaven** and on **earth** are restored!! The **Preface Prayer** of **the Mass** is prayed to give *thanksgiving* to God through Jesus Christ. **St. Robert Bellarmine** taught that the Church uses the **Preface** to stir us up – to **inspire** us – to get us **excited** that we are about to witness Jesus coming to earth, undergoing His Passion, dying for us, and rising to restore our life!!! You see, by the Eucharist that we celebrate, grace is given to us – the love of God is poured into our hearts (as Bishop Flores would say). Think of God the Father as a fountain or better yet as a great reservoir of water such as is formed by the Hoover dam in Nevada. God the Father has so much more love (grace) to give us – more love than there is water in Lake Mead; yet because, of **sin** – **mankind** is parched – dry as a desert – without grace – without God's **love**. Jesus is the canal, the One who touches God the Father with one hand (so to speak) and mankind with the other hand! Because of *the Life* of the perfect Man, Jesus Christ, mankind, who was like a parched land has become a lush garden – watered every time the Mass is celebrated – we are fruitful and green—because the floodgates have been opened to us—the **Blood** from the Sacred-side of Jesus has been **poured** into us! This is what the **Preface Prayer**



of the Mass gives *thanksgiving* for. We are **encouraged** at the end of the Preface Prayer (when we pray the *Holy, holy, holy Lord* prayer) to sing as the Seraphim and the Cherubim sing. Just as the Seraphim and the **Cherubim** sing the praises of God, because the life of Jesus has made them forget that their **brother angels** fell from grace; so too, we are **encouraged** to sing **joyfully**, because the life of Jesus has made us forget that we too are sinners banished from Heaven the Eucharist makes us only think of the great Saints we and our beloved dead will become in Heaven!
